As 2017 has drawn to a close we have reflected on yet another amazing year in ministry. God has been faithful in allowing us to fulfill our calling, based on James 1:27, to care for widows and orphans in their distress.

"Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to care for orphans and widows in their distress, and to keep oneself unstained by the world."

Our work has grown through the following means:

- Expanding our scope into 4 African countries to train caregivers to address the grief issues of orphans by expanding our scope into 4 African countries
- Providing additional education and helping establish caregiver support groups to organizations that have already received training.
- 3 Implementing a year of discipleship for our MASTERS graduates.
- 4 Launching a new partnership called the *Primach Farm*, designed to care for vulnerable children and provide financial support for our programs.

Through it all we have been struck with a very simple fact. The numbers are exciting; 250 caregivers trained, 4 country expansions and over 1,800 orphans impacted by our efforts. Those numbers represent people with real life situations that have improved because of our work! We're excited about this growth and we trust you will be, too.

#### TESTIMONY

## **Lesotho- Baylor Children's Hospital**

This young boy had been "chased" out of the village.

To be "chased", means that a family or a village has decided that you cannot live there any longer. All your belongings are thrown out of the house and the door is barred. In this case, the child was sent outside of the village. The boy was rejected by the village

and forced out because of his "highly aggressive" behavior.

However, after the participants went through the training, they realized that the root cause of this boy's behavior was actually grief. The participants decided to do something about it. Because of the training, they felt they were equipped with an understanding of grief and of the boy's situation so that they met with the village

leaders and shared the knowledge they had gained through the training with the leaders. After this discussion, the village leaders realized they had mis-handled the situation. Here was someone grieving that they could help, not reject.

The village leaders decided to allow the boy back into the village.

I knew grief was the root cause of the children I see. I determined to use my skills in every counseling session. The results have been more than I could have expected.

## 5 TRAININGS

Our signature program, How to Love a Grieving Child training, is designed to equip caregivers and others to effectively guide orphans through the issue of grief and loss in their lives.

In 2017 we trained more than 200 new caregivers and, as a result, 1,800 orphans have been impacted!

We expanded our scope to 4 countries this year - Zambia, Lesotho, Zimbabwe and Malawi - and provided training to caregivers of children's homes, pastors and compassion ministry workers who work with orphans.

Our staff also had the chance to return to the SOS Children Village of Chipata Zambia to encourage the 30 house moms and staff and 200 orphans they cared for in that children's home.

# 5 FOLLOW UP VISITATION

At Hope for Grieving Children we believe in partnership, not just in providing training for training's sake. Once we work with an organization, we intentionally return for multiple visits to visit those who were trained.

In 2017 we visited five previously trained sites and established 12 ongoing support groups for trained caregivers.

More than 100 caregivers received additional training.

When we visit the caregivers and community leaders who were trained, we are diligent to monitor and assess the impact of our training.

We intentionally look at how equipped caregivers are in dealing with the unique challenges of grief that the orphans exhibit.

We look at the institutional impact our training has had, and document the specific behavior improvements in the orphans themselves.

MASTERS school is designed to train and equip young adult orphans with the skills to earn an independent living and to engage in marketplace ministry.


We spent this year discipling and equipping them to realize their potential as children of God and to take that realization into their communities to be salt and light where they live.

# All 35 of our graduates are now living independently, no longer under the care of caregivers. All are either employed or working their own small businesses. Most have now taken in extended family and are caring for their cousins and younger siblings by supporting school fees, medical expenses and by providing safe and secure places for these younger Children to live.
